An estimated 186,680 cases of melanoma will be diagnosed in 2023.


Of those, 89,070 cases will be noninvasive (in situ) and 97,610 cases will be invasive.

58,120 cases will occur in males. 39,490 cases will occur in females.

There will be 7,990 deaths from the disease.

5,420 men are expected to die from the disease.

2,570 women are expected to die from the disease.

The number of melanoma deaths is expected to increase by 4.4 percent in 2023.

In the past decade (2013 – 2023), the number of new invasive melanoma cases diagnosed annually increased by 27 percent.

Men age 49 and under have a higher probability of developing melanoma than any other cancer but colon and rectum cancers.

Women age 49 and under are more likely to develop melanoma than any other cancer except breast and thyroid cancers.
